Why participate?

Many people with Parkinson's Disease (PD) suffer from gastrointestinal problems such as nausea and constipation. Gastrointestinal problems may decrease how well the body absorbs your PD medications.

Even if you don't have any gastrointestinal complaints, you may be eligible to participate.

What is involved?

- A few visits to our clinic in Richmond, Virginia - some long, some short
- Taking either the study drug or a placebo
- Answering questions about yourself at each visit
- Physical tests to assess health and digestion

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
